This system is referred to as ChamberTrust-eVault ("CeV"), is based on a hybrid blockchain model and has a proven history for well over a decade as a trade documentation and shipping manifest service developed for the world's largest, oldest business organization.

CeV is, of course, a high-security IP protection systems that includes automatic digital receipts, is

complex-multi-lingual capable and also has an automatic file comparison process that will not allow duplicates to be loaded, even if renamed - an important factor for IP protection. And this is all done in cooperation with the world-wide chamber of commerce system (13,000 communities in over 160 countries, encompassing over 40 million members). Chambers of Commerce have been respected parts of business communities around the world for over 400 years. CTMI has been working with the world chambers network (WCN) for over 20 years to build this system. Now it is commercially expanding beyond chambers and their members.

In addition to CeV, CTMI also has services to host and advertise businesses (including newly commercialized ones) to a global business-oriented audience, complete with a global media room for participants. This also lends itself to business incubation and business partner search.

So any innovators or creators hoping to maintain a verifiable record of their IP, and in turn, to maintain evidence and some protection of the commercial value of their IP, should consider investing in the protections provided by CTMI. The same holds for commercialization roll-outs.
